- 2 practices now have the 'Responsive' domain as Inadequate with Inadequate in all the **Population Groups**
- Next season Influenza vaccine stock needs to be ordered for 2020/21
- During COVID-19, practices will not be required to report to commissioners about FFT results.

Actions

- Collaboration between CCG Infection Prevention and Control Cell/Primary Care and Logistics (COVID-19)
- Quality/CQC/Primary Care Development and Contracting to managing issues regarding quality and resilience.
- Quality Team supporting practices with RI CQC ratings and Inadequate domains.
- Influenza vaccine ordering collaboration with Medicines Management and Screening & Immunisations (SCRIMS)to manage practice stock ordering for 2020/21 and actions with those who haven't ordered.

Risks/assurance gaps

- Widespread COVID-19 spread and implications for containment/treatment/workforce
- Suspension of routine CQC inspections


