
- Collaboration between CCG Infection Prevention and Control Cell/Primary Care and Logistics (COVID-19)


- Escalations regarding safety and quality of care where there may be safeguarding concerns

### **Recovery actions**


- Collaboration across the CCG/One Care/LMC/Severnside to support practices during COVID-19

- Collaboration with Medicines Management, PHE Screening and Immunisations to manage Influenza vaccine ordering for season 2020/21



### Assurance

- No GP practices have been assessed as inadequate in any domain
- Practices with CQC issues are reported to PCCC (closed)





The most recent results for the Friends and Family Test (FFT) data are BNSSG CCG 91.3% of respondents would not recommend their GP for February 2020. This shows that 58 would recommend their GP Practice; practice was 6.1%. This is 2.1% higher BNSSG CCG practices submitted their this is 0.9% above the national the national average and a 1.5% data to NHS England as contractually required. This is a compliance rate of previous month. 71.6% which is above the national rate of 57.9%. Please note that submission of FFT data has now been suspended for the Covid 19 period.

Recommendation rates: average and a 1.4% increase from the decrease on the previous month.
