





BNSSG ICB LAUNCHING FELLOWSHIP 2023 – Guidance

Expressions of interest are invited for 18 months Launching Fellowship from individuals with a strong academic record who wish to develop a career in primary care/community care/social care/public health research. The goal of the fellowship is for the appointee to publish papers from their PhD and write an application to secure future funding (e.g., an NIHR fellowship). This opportunity provides successful candidates with a platform to develop as an independent researcher and future leader in research.

Eligibility criteria

- Applicants will have obtained their research doctorate or submitted their PhD or MD thesis for examination, within 3 years of the time of applying.
- Applicants must have experience of research in primary care/community care/social care/public health.
- The applicant must be looking to secure their first research grant or first post-doctoral fellowship. Therefore, a key selection criterion is the likelihood of the individual making a successful grant or fellowship application within 18 months of taking up this fellowship.

The Launching Fellowship must be taken up by 31st March 2024. Although the successful candidate will be employed by and based at their current institution, this is a collaborative venture between NHS Bristol, North Somerset & South Gloucestershire Integrated Care Board and the University of Bristol or University of the West of England. The post is for 18 months full-time salary or equivalent. The full-time salary for 18 months can be taken part-time if preferred. This should be outlined within your application.

The awards are open to all disciplines relevant to primary care/community care/social care/public health research, including clinical and non-clinical disciplines; work which aligns to a published health care system priority area is preferred. This Launching Fellowship award was designed for non-clinical academics, however candidates with medical or other health related degrees can apply, although the funding award may not stretch as far as 18 months due to comparable pay differences between clinical and non-clinical academics.

Remuneration for Launching Fellowships will be equivalent to university spine point range 30-34 per annum.

Launching Fellowship awards may involve working on a specific study (e.g., systematic review or pilot study) that will prepare the way for a larger externally funded grant or successful post-doctoral fellowship application. It will also involve attachment to a research group involved in a programme of research. For information of these programmes, please refer to the links below.

Applicants will need to demonstrate outstanding potential to obtain an externally funded research grant or fellowship within 18 months of taking up the fellowship. This might be evidenced, for example, by a good publication record (taking into account their stage of career), involvement in grant applications, and/or signs of high academic ability.







HOW TO MAKE AN APPLICATION

The application process consists of two stages.

Stage 1: Application

Interested individuals are invited to send a complete application form and submit a 2 page CV. Your application should be sent by email to <u>bnssg.research@nhs.net</u>

Please put Launching Fellowship 2023 as the subject of the email. Applications must be received by 17:00 (GMT) on 31st July 2023.

Stage 2: Interview

Candidates will be invited to attend an interview, either online or at the 360 Office, the office of NHS Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire ICB in September 2023.
