<p>On 22 January 2024, the ICB received a petition from members of the public about the shortage of NHS dentists in the Bishopston and Ashley Down area.</p> <p>In total approximately 204 members of the public signed the petition totalling 22 pages. The petition has not been validated from duplicates and most signatories provided a BNSSG postcode though some postcodes were omitted.</p>

Key Points for Discussion:		
<p>On 30 January 2024, the ICB received a petition from members of the public about the planned closure of a Boots pharmacy in Bournville, Weston-Super-Mare.</p> <p>On line and paper copy versions of the petition exist. The online version of the petition can be found here: Petition · Save Our Boots Pharmacy from Closure in Bournville Weston-super-Mare · Change.org. The ICB has not yet received the hard copy version of the petition which is to be posted.</p> <p>594 people have signed the online petition. The individual sharing details of the petition with the ICB indicates that there are over 400 signatories listed on the paper copy version of the petition.</p> <p>The numbers signing the online petition have not been validated for duplicates, and it is not possible to determine whether signatories are all from the BNSSG population.</p> <p>Linked to this petition, The ICB has been sent correspondence for the attention of the ICB Board that is addressed to the Managing Director of Boots. 210 signatories ask that the plan to close the Boots pharmacy is reconsidered due to the impact on the local population.</p>
