	Secondary Uses Service data held by the ICB indicates that in the 12-month period ending 31/08/2022:
	 449 patients had at least one elective admission, where MS was recorded in the diagnosis code field (in any diagnosis position)
	 348 patients had at least one emergency (non-elective) admission where MS was recorded in the diagnosis code field (in any diagnosis position)
	 3 patients had an outpatient appointment where MS was recorded in the primary diagnosis field.
	The inclusion of an MS flag means this was a condition treated or investigated during the episode of healthcare.



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	The data includes BNSSG ICB registered or resident patients who attended a secondary care acute setting in the BNSSG ICB area or outside the BNSSG area.
