BNSSG ICB are in the process of aligning the hourly care rates for Personal Health Budgets using the NHS agenda for change pay scales as a guide. Our CHC team has developed a tool to establish the appropriate hourly rate based on the complexity of care tasks. For example: • a patient with standard needs would be highlighted as tier 2 with an hourly rate of £10.37. • a patient with complex needs would be highlighted as tier 3 with an hourly rate of £11.11 per hour. The above figures are for 2022/23 and will be adjusted as part of an annual uplift process for 2023/24.
5. What was the standard hourly care rate, with which you calculated your indicative personal health budgets on 1 April 2018*, broken down for Agency and Personal Assistant care? Please understand this in relation to individuals in receipt of domiciliary care packages through Standard NHS Continuing Healthcare.
