There has not been a single, specific criteria or formula for acute services. Investment has taken account of merging strategic priorities, recovery of core services, requirements of NHS England (NHSE) operational plan and long term plan.

Can the Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire Integrated Care Board clarify whether they plan to adhere to the Advisory Committee on the Resource Allocation's (ACRA) proposed needs-based allocations methodology to determine the distribution of financial resources for its acute services?	ACRA formula is used as a source of information to guide resource allocation decisions, such as reviewing resource use at locality partnership level and as a weighting for investment in Community MH Framework and Discharge to Assess resources.
