Sirona is unable to pull out the information for the number of ADHD assessments conducted. A Paediatrician will often assess for multiple conditions alongside ADHD so the service is unable to accurately obtain this number without reviewing each individual record. b. as of 01/06/2023 Average wait time for all paediatric clients – 35 weeks. As above, all ADHD children sit on the general Paediatric pathway. c. Same as point a. The information requested is contained within an individual client's health record. A child will be rejected at point of triage if they do not meet the appropriate referral criteria. d. Same as point a, unable to differentiate the general paediatric list from that of ADHD without reviewing each individual client record.
