I can confirm that the ICB does hold some of the information requested; please see responses below:

QUESTION	RESPONSE
Is there a named person/position within the ICB with the responsibility to ensure that the ICB has access to sufficient radiotherapy treatment capacity?	BNSSG (Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire) consistently achieves the national Treatment Standard for Radiotherapy. If radiotherapy treatment capacity became an area of challenge/concern, the Head of Elective Care at the ICB would work with the appropriate Providers to address this.
2. Does the ICB have a plan, either internal or published, to ensure that there is a rolling programme of radiotherapy machine replacement to ensure that no machines within the area of the ICB are outside their 10-year recommended lifespan?	The responsibility for machine maintenance / replacement sits with the Provider.
