Depending on the result of that assessment, he policy's purpose is to then support people to have interventions, according to certain clinical criteria, that could help achieve onception.

BNSSG ICB are aware of the government's Women's Health Strategy for England updated on 30 August 2022 and the 10-year ambitions and actions the government says it will take for fertility care. As noted in the Ministerial Forward, it is a ten-year strategy setting out the aspirations for improving equality of opportunity in accessing health services. BNSSG ICB is awaiting updated guidance on the implementation of the Women's Health Strategy from The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence and NHS England. Guidance is due for publication in 2024.
