I am wondering how Practice Plus group determines what services it can and cannot offer within the Endocrinology speciality. For example, would it be acceptable for the provider to purely do outpatient services? Or would it be acceptable for the provider to offer a colposcopy but not a coil fitting? How is this governed by the ICB?	<ul> <li>Providers are managed in line with NHS Contracts and that is the governance process. All contracts with providers contain the following clauses in line with the NHS Standard contract:</li> <li>The services will include, where appropriate;</li> <li>Pre-treatment e.g. referral processes; triage/clinical assessment; diagnostics; consultation; pre-treatment assessment and / or work up.</li> <li>Treatment e.g. outpatient/ambulatory/inpatient treatment; joint assessments.</li> <li>Discharge e.g. expected physical, self-care, psychological capabilities prior to discharge.</li> </ul>

Hope that would be obvious but it should be the latter. thanks	The providers must be able to offer the full patient pathway at specialty level for acute elective surgery from the first outpatient to completion of treatment with the exception of relevant cataract treatment referrals (see 3.5.3 and schedule 6C below) or occupational therapy / physiotherapy, (as contained in 3.5.3 below).
